How familiar are you with our organization? Do you have any relationships with current board

members or employees?

*As a teacher in the Oceanside Unified School District, I am aware that for some students, PVC is a most viable, tuition-free alternative to our standard Comprehensive high schools. I have researched PVC and know of some students who have been successful there. That is the extent of my familiarity.

I have known the Gleisbergs for approximately 20 years. Mary Gleisberg is the Principal who brought me to OUSD as a School Base Resource Teacher. Mary is a friend and mentor to me to this day. I am currently a teacher at Oceanside High School. I am the Social Studies Department Chair and teach regular and AP courses.

What would you hope to help us accomplish as a member of the board?

*The manifestation of the mission to facilitate PVC graduates who have the 'skills to be life-long, reflective learners who are effective global communicators and who are able to be objective, rational decision makers."

How do you view the role of a board member?

*I believe the role of a board is the strategic task of setting the organization's goals, direction, limitations and accountability frameworks that ensure students receive a quality educational program. I believe board members should not only possess the relevant skills needed to monitor the progress and achievements of the organization in relation to its objectives and mission, but also have at least one member who is representative of the particular community/population group being served. As an educator, I believe I bring knowledge of current trends, strategies and common core standards.

Discuss your approach to governance and commitment?

* Much the same as my approach to Instruction....FACILITATOR, not sage on the stage or director! I am results focused: vision outcomes, cost result, consumer/client result. As dept. chair, I have clear items on the agenda as to the direction we must go, but I am willing to consider and modify or incorporate input from members. I honor and appreciate the right of members to question, disagree, and challenge. I also believe members need to respect others' viewpoints, whether they subscribe to them or not. I am passionate about any task I take on and hope my enthusiasm will be contagious. I am able to compromise and will support whatever decision is made....fully, not passive-aggressively.

Discuss the importance of meeting attendance?

*Absolutely important and should be a priority for board, committee, council, whatever....members! It is not only important to attend physically, but to bring research or info on whatever agenda items are to be discussed at the meeting...so <u>attend MENTALLY</u> as well !

Educational Philosophy

*I believe that each student is a unique individual who needs a secure, caring, and stimulating atmosphere in which to grow and mature emotionally, intellectually, physically, and socially. It is my desire as an educator to help students meet their fullest potential in these areas by providing an environment that is safe, encourages and supports risk-taking, and invites a sharing of ideas. There are three elements that I believe are conducive to establishing such an environment, (1) the teacher acting as a guide, (2) allowing the child's natural curiosity to direct his/her learning, and (3) promoting respect for all things and all people. {Obviously, I whole-heartedly support the Mission & Vision statements of Pacific View Charter HS.}

For students to construct knowledge, they need the opportunity to discover for themselves and practice skills in authentic situations. Providing students access to hands-on activities and allowing adequate time and space to use materials that reinforce the lesson being studied creates an opportunity for individual discovery and construction of knowledge to occur.

Equally important to self-discovery is having the opportunity to study things that are meaningful and relevant to one's life and interests. Developing a curriculum around student interests fosters intrinsic motivation and stimulates the passion to learn. One way to take learning in a direction relevant to student interest is to invite student dialogue about the lessons and units of study. Given the opportunity for input, students generate ideas and set goals that make for much richer activities than I could have created or imagined myself. When students have ownership in the curriculum, they are motivated to work hard and master the skills necessary to reach their goals.

{Another fit for PVC....students CHOOSE to come, their parents have a partnership role, and their individual styles of learning are considered. All things not necessarily components of a Comprehensive HS.}

It is my hope that students will not only develop a love of learning but will arm themselves with the tools of critical thinking,that will allow them to be successful in any venue!
