- ITT came and presented on September 4 and Kaplan will be coming the first part of October
- 4 Read 180 started last week and both classes are full

- Students are coming to work on campus in teacher offices this year. Our goal is to have 85% to 90% coming in giving them additional support
- With this change we have experienced space challenges but have been able to accommodate all the students at this time
- 4 Our marketing efforts have increased with attending Farmer's markets and having a meet and greet at Starbucks this afternoon which was very successful
- Other events are being scheduled at Coldstone, Fresh-n-Easy, Barnes&Noble and other Farmer's Markets in other communities around the county
- Along with Read 180 we have started using Star Enterprise this year to track assessment data for students. Gayl will be presenting information on Star Enterprise later in the meeting

AMENDMENT NUMBER THREE TO PACIFIC VIEW CHARTER SCHOOL CAFETERIA PLAN

BY THIS AGREEMENT, Pacific View Charter School Cafeteria Plan (herein referred to as the "Plan") is hereby amended as follows, effective as of January 1, 2013:

1. The Section in the Health Care Reimbursement Plan or Health Flexible Spending Account entitled "Limitation on Allocations" is amended to read as follows:

The maximum amount that may be allocated to the Health Flexible Spending Account by a Participant in or on account of any Plan Year is \$2,500.

Notwithstanding anything in this Health Flexible Spending Account Plan to the contrary, for all Plan years beginning on or after January 1, 2013, in no event may a Participant elect to make salary reduction contributions in excess of the Code Section 125(i) limit. The maximum allowable limit for plan years beginning on or after January 1, 2013 is \$2,500 (which may be adjusted in subsequent years as prescribed in Code Section 125(i)(2)).

INTRODUCTION

Pacific View Charter School has amended your Flexible Spending Account Plan as of January 1, 2013.

This is merely a summary of the most important changes to the Plan. It is presented to you as an addition to the Summary Plan Description. If you have any questions, contact the Administrator. A copy of the Plan, including this amendment, is available for your inspection. If there is any discrepancy between the terms of the Plan or the amendment itself and this summary of material modifications, the provisions of the Plan, as amended, will control.

II GENERAL INFORMATION ABOUT THE PLAN

There is certain general information which you may need to know about Amendment Number THREE to the Plan. This information has been summarized for you in this Section.

1. General Plan Information

Pacific View Charter School Cafeteria Plan is the name of the Plan.

The amended provisions of the Plan become effective on January 1, 2013, unless otherwise provided.

Your Employer has assigned Plan Number 501 to your Plan.

Any such determination by the Administrator is conclusive and binding upon all persons.

III SUMMARY OF CHANGES

1. Health Flexible Spending Account

The Health Flexible Spending Account enables you to pay for expenses allowed under Sections 105 and 213(d) of the Internal Revenue Code which are not covered by our insured medical plan and save taxes at the same time. The Health Flexible Spending Account allows you to be reimbursed by the Employer for expenses incurred by you and your dependents.

Drug costs, including insulin, may be reimbursed.

You may be reimbursed for "over the counter" drugs only if those drugs are prescribed for you. You may not, however, be reimbursed for the cost of other health care coverage maintained outside of the Plan, or for long-term care expenses. A list of covered expenses is available from the Administrator.

For plan years beginning on or after January 1, 2013, unless your Plan has specified a lesser amount, your salary reduction contributions will be limited, as required under Code Section 125(i), to \$2,500 (may be adjusted in subsequent years for inflation).

The most that you can contribute to your Health Flexible Spending Account each Plan Year is \$2,500. In order to be reimbursed for a health care expense, you must submit to the Administrator an itemized bill from the service provider. We may provide you with the option to elect a debit card to use to pay for medical expenses. The Administrator will provide you with further details. Amounts reimbursed from the Plan may not be claimed as a deduction on your personal income tax return. Reimbursement from the fund shall be paid at least once a month. Expenses under this Plan are treated as being "incurred" when you are provided with the care that gives rise to the expenses, not when you are formally billed or charged, or you pay for the medical care.
