- ✚ Enrollment is now 467 students; 284 H/S, 147 K-8, and 36 K12®.
- ✚ Advisory is reviewing WASC on an ongoing basis.
- ✚ There was a fundraiser held last Thursday at Panda Express on Oceanside Blvd.
- ✚ CAHSEE Testing will be held on February 1 & 2.
- ✚ There will be a Staff Development tomorrow on Best Practices within our school.
- ✚ We continue to rotate our Meet and Greet with the Informational Tours on a weekly basis here at the facility.
- ✚ We are investigating the e-rate program for our school. If we qualify we can receive a 60% discount on our communication services.
- ✚ Our Annual Carnival/Science Fair will be May 18. We would love to have any of you that are interested be judges for the Science Fair. Judging the science projects will take place from 3:00 pm to 4:00 pm on Tuesday, May 17 just prior to the Board Meeting. Martha, Bob, Darbi & Ann all volunteered to judge.

- ✚ Our P1 ADA came in at 489; the budget was built on 428. That will give the state a snapshot of what will be due to us.

- ✚ P2 is our funding module and we anticipate that our ADA will stay about the same.
- ✚ Next month's budget will reflect an additional 50 of the 61 ADA built into it.
- ✚ Revised budget shows the payback of the \$150K we borrowed from the Special Reserve Fund. Another transfer may happen depending on the deferrals and cuts in the state budget.
- ✚ The CDE is suggesting that we build two budget scenarios; one if the state does not make any more cuts and the other a worst case scenario.

- ✚ During the rains we had some leaks in this suite. Lori, who handles our emergency and deferred maintenance, contacted the property manager who came out and looked at all the issues at hand. The property manager brought a General Contractor with him and the decision is that the association will make the repairs at no cost to us.
- ✚ We researched the build-out of the warehouses to classrooms and the architect's estimate came in at \$600+k. We contacted a contractor who came out and gave us an estimate of \$100k.
- ✚ I have a meeting at the City of Oceanside to start the process to amend the CUP to accommodate 750 students. We will be assigned a planning engineer. This should be on the March planning agenda.
- ✚ The City will be sending out notices to the surrounding businesses in the area of our intent to grow our program

**WHEREAS**, school districts in the State of California have determined there is a continuing need for insured and self-insurance plans for fringe benefits and desire to combine their respective efforts to establish and maintain Fringe Benefit Programs as authorized by law; and

**WHEREAS**, Title I, Division 7, Chapter 5, Article I (Sections 6500 et seq.) of the Government Code of the State of California authorizes joint exercise of two or more public agencies of any power common to them; and

**WHEREAS**, Sections 35214, 17566, 17567, 81602, and 81603 of the Education Code authorize a school district to establish a plan for health, vision, mental wellness, physical wellness, dental, IRC Section 125, life, long term care, prepaid legal, long term disability, deferred compensation, voluntary benefits, or any other fringe benefits plan as authorized by law;

**WHEREAS**, the Pacific View Charter School is a member of and has executed an Articles of Agreement to the San Diego County Schools Fringe Benefits Consortium requires that the Board of member districts designate and appoint an FBC representative.

**WHEREAS**, Title I, Division 7, Chapter 5, Article I (Sections 6500 et seq.) of the Government Code of the State of California authorizes joint exercise of two or more public agencies of any power common to them; and

**WHEREAS**, Sections 35214, 17566, 17567, 81602, and 81603 of the Education Code authorize a school district to establish insured and self-insurance plans for workers' compensation, property and liability, miscellaneous property or any other risk or plan authorized by law;

**WHEREAS** Pacific View Charter School is a member of and has executed an Articles of Agreement to the San Diego County Schools Risk Management Joint Powers Authority (JPA) and the JPA Agreement requires that the Board of member districts designate and appoint a JPA representative.

**BYLAWS  
OF  
PACIFIC VIEW CHARTER SCHOOL**

**Purposes**

The corporation is organized for the public purposes as specified in its Articles of Incorporation.

**Offices**

**Principal Office.**

The corporation's principal office shall be located at such place within the County of San Diego, California as the Board of Trustees ("Board") shall determine. The Board has full power and authority to change the principal office from one location to another within the attendance boundaries in the County of San Diego, California.

**Other Offices.**

Branch or subordinate offices may at any time be established by the Board at any place or places where the corporation is qualified to do business.

**Membership**

**No Members.**

The Corporation shall have no members as that term is defined in Section 5056 of the California Nonprofit Corporation Law.

**Associates.**

Nothing in this Article shall be construed to limit the corporation's right to refer to persons associated with it as "members" even though such persons are not members, and no such reference by the corporation shall render anyone a member within the meaning of Section 5056 of the California Nonprofit Corporation Law. Such individuals may originate and take part in the discussion of any subject that may properly come before any meeting of the Board, but may not vote. The corporation may confer, by amendment of its Articles of Incorporation or of these Bylaws, some or all of a member's rights, set forth in the California Nonprofit Corporation Law, upon any person who does not have the right to vote for the election of trustees/directors, on a disposition of substantially all of the assets of the corporation, on a merger, on a dissolution, or

on changes to the corporation's Articles of Incorporation or Bylaws, but no such person shall be a member within the meaning of Section 5056.

## **Board of Trustees**

### **Powers.**

Subject to the limitations of the California Nonprofit Public Benefit Corporation Law, the corporation's Articles of Incorporation and these Bylaws, and such California local public agency laws of general application as may be applicable to the corporation, the activities and affairs of the corporation shall be conducted and all corporate powers shall be exercised by or under the direction of the Board. The Board may delegate the management of the corporation's activities to any person(s), management company or committees, however composed, provided that the activities and affairs of the corporation shall be managed and all corporate powers shall be exercised under the ultimate direction of the Board. No assignment, referral or delegation of authority by the Board or anyone acting under such delegation shall preclude the Board from exercising full authority over the conduct of the corporation's activities, and the Board may rescind any such assignment, referral or delegation at any time.

Without prejudice to its general powers, but subject to the same limitations set forth above, the Board shall have the following powers in addition to any other powers enumerated in these Bylaws and permitted by law:

- i. To select and remove all of the officers, agents and employees of the corporation; to prescribe powers and duties for them which are not inconsistent with law, the corporation's Articles of Incorporation or these Bylaws; to fix their compensation; and to require security from them for faithful service;
- ii. To conduct the affairs and activities of the corporation and to make such rules and regulations therefore which are not inconsistent with law, the corporation's Articles of Incorporation or these Bylaws;
- iii. To adopt, make and use a corporate seal and to alter the form of the seal from time to time;
- iv. To borrow money and incur indebtedness for the purposes of the corporation, and to cause to be executed and delivered therefore, in the corporate name, promissory notes, bonds, debentures, deeds of trust, mortgages, pledges, hypothecations and other evidences of debt and securities therefore;

- v. To carry on a business and apply any revenues in excess of expenses that results from the business activity to any activity in which it may lawfully engage;
- vi. To act as trustee under any trust incidental to the principal object of the corporation, and receive, hold, administer, exchange and expend funds and property subject to such trust;
- vii. To acquire by purchase, exchange, lease, gift, devise, bequest, or otherwise, and to hold, improve, lease, sublease, mortgage, transfer in trust, encumber, convey or otherwise dispose of real and personal property; and
- viii. To assume any obligations, enter into any contracts or other instruments, and do any and all other things incidental or expedient to the attainment of any corporate purpose.
- ix. To carry out such other duties as are described in the Charter of the Pacific View Charter School ("School") as approved by the Oceanside Unified School District.

Number of Trustees.

The number of trustees of the corporation shall be seven to nine (7-9) unless and until changed by amendment of the Articles of Incorporation or by amendment of these bylaws.

Section 3. Appointment and Election.

a. ~~The following persons shall be ex officio, non-voting trustees of the Board: (i) the Founding Director of the School and, (2) the Chief Financial Officer/Treasurer (hereinafter referred to as the Business Manager).~~

a. The Oceanside Unified School District shall appoint one (1) individual to serve the board in an Advisory capacity.

b. The Board shall appoint four (4) trustees, (i) at least one of whom may be a parent of one or more children who are actively enrolled in the School during such parent's entire term as a trustee, provided that such parent shall not be an employee of the corporation or the School ("Parent Trustee"); The remainder may be individuals living in the community, and/or a business person in the community served by the school

Section 4. Terms of Office of Trustees.

- a. In accordance with Section 5220(d) of the California Nonprofit Public Benefit Corporation Law, all trustees appointed under Section 3.b of

this Article shall hold office until the person entitled to appoint the trustee removes or appoints a new trustee, or these bylaws are amended to provide otherwise or are repealed; and all *ex officio* trustees shall hold office until such individual(s) no longer hold the position(s) described in Section 3.a and 3.b of this Article or these bylaws are amended to provide otherwise or are repealed.

- b. Board Trustee One (1) shall have a term of office of one (1) year.

**Pacific View Charter School  
Public Hearing for Flexibility Transfer  
February 15, 2011**

The Budget trailer bill (SBX3 4) gives local school agencies the authority to use the funds received from the state for Tier III programs for “any educational purpose, to the extent permitted by federal law.”

Following are the Tier III categorical programs budgeted for 2010/11 which have been allocated to unrestricted general fund by resource.

Administration is inviting public discussion and requesting Board approval to consider the proposed use of 2010/11 Unrestricted General Fund Resource 0922 & 0923 for the 2010/11 school year. In addition these two state categorical programs can be transferred to any “educational purpose” for the period from 2008/09 to 2012/13 as provided in Budget trailer bill SBX3 4. These funds will be used for textbooks, books other than textbooks, curriculum software and instructional supplies.

The result of the transfer will be that the restrictions placed by the State on expenditures of these funds will be removed and the items listed are permitted expenditures under both state and federal law.
